HOLY FATHER'S APOSTOLIC VISIT TO INDONESIA, PAPUA NEW GUINEA, TIMOR-LESTE, AND SINGAPORE.



SEPTEMBER 2-13, 2024

Indonesia is the fourth largest country in the world. Its territory of 17 thousand islands is 3,107 miles long and spans three time zones. According to the Indonesian Episcopal Conference, there are about 10.5 million Catholics in 34 provinces, out of a population of over 275 million, of whom over 80 percent are Muslims (most are Sunni Muslims). The term "atheist" does not exist in this country. The ID card contains a section called "religion," and the law requires every citizen to fill it out. (Interestingly, Catholics in Indonesia are not classified as Christians, but as followers of a separate religion. Indonesians therefore who are identified as Christians on their ID cards are exclusively Protestants).

Despite being a country with a majority Muslim population, Sunday is a day off

from work. The Holy See was one of the first to recognize the new nation that had gained independence. In 1947, the papal representative was already officially present in Jakarta. This is an important point in the history of the Catholic Church in the archipelago. Evangelization of these areas began with the Franciscans in the 14th century, but the first permanent missionaries arrived from Portugal to the Maluku Islands in the early 15th century and brought the Gospel there. Then, with the presence of Dutch colonizers (for 350 years), who were supporters of Calvinism, the spread of the Catholic faith was restricted. It was not until the 19th century that the Dutch government of the East Indies granted Catholics freedom of mission, and evangelization intensified after the declaration of Indonesian independence in 1947. Catholics were integrated into the nation from the beginning and **the first Indonesian bishop Albert Soejapranata** coined the phrase: "To be one hundred percent Catholic and one hundred percent Indonesian". There are big differences in the reach and presence of the Church in the archipelago: Flores is an island where the majority of the population is Catholic, while in West Sumatra, this percentage is close to zero.

Cardinal Ignatius **Suharyo Hardjoatmodjo** emphasized that the symbol of interreligious harmony is the location of the Cathedral and the Istiqlal mosque, which stand opposite each other in the Indonesian capital to convey to everyone a message of fruitful dialogue and harmony. The cathedral was built at the beginning of the 20th century, and then a mosque was built deliberately in this location.

"**Sukarno**, the father of the fatherland and the first president, wanted it in this place for two reasons: on this land stood a Dutch castle, so the memory of colonialism was replaced; secondly, the presence of the cathedral and the mosque in the great independence square has become a powerful symbol of our religious harmony," emphasized **Cardinal Hardjoatmodjo**. This symbol of friendship is complemented by the recently completed "tunnel of brotherhood" between these two buildings, which will be visited by Pope Francis..... The two main Islamic associations, **Muhammadiyah** and **Nahdlatul Ulama**, which are home to millions of Muslims, have been at the forefront of promoting and maintaining interfaith coexistence and isolating radicals. - Construction, Phase II: \$69,700

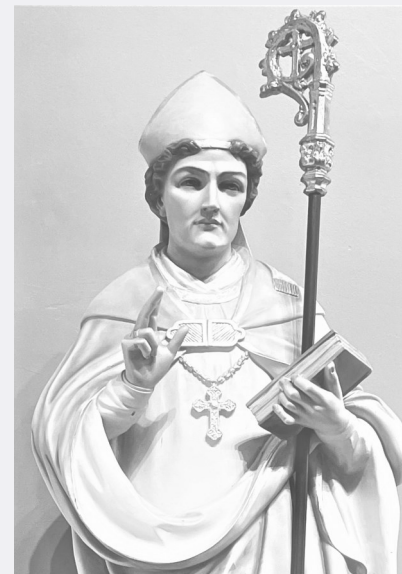
Dedication of the completed building is tentatively scheduled to take place in November 2024!
