

The wise men: Who were they, these mysterious figures from the "the East," as Matthew describes them. Astrologers? Royalty? Scholars? Nabatean emissaries from the great city of Petra? We don't know. What we do know is that they were seekers, men on a mission, determined to find the little King who had arrived to fulfill every promise of the divine and human story, every ache of the human heart.

And then there was Herod, one of the smallest minds in Scripture, the Modern Man, the materialistic, me-focused character who believed in nothing beyond this world. It never occurred to him, in his desire to own the world, that in a manger in Bethlehem, a mere five and a half miles from his palace in Jerusalem, lay a baby whose tiny being contained the entire divine order, all of reality, every iota of what is. Herod missed it all. Keeping his eyes on himself, in the way of the tyrant, his all-consuming will vanquished his reason, and he missed the axis of history revealed during his very watch.

The wise men, however, knew where to look—not down or in, but out, beyond themselves. Ever on the alert, when they saw the guiding star, they rose and went out—toward the truth.

When at journey's end they met the true answer to all their questions, God himself in his mother's arms, they did what wise men do naturally.

They worshiped.

This Week's Message:

"The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Savior of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wise men (magi) from the East, together with his baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. In the magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the Jews shows



that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that 'the full number of the nations' now takes its 'place in the family of the patriarchs,' and acquires Israelitica dignitas (is made 'worthy of the heritage of Israel')."




