AUGUST 15TH SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY.



The history of the Church is blessed with mystics, whom God has blessed with the revelation of various mysteries. One of such mystics is **Venerable Mary of Agreda** who had a vision of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin, which she recorded in the book *The Mystical City of God*, revealed to her by the Blessed Virgin Mary. In her *Mystical City of God*, she records that the Immaculate Mother of God survived Her Divine Son 21 years and that She died peacefully at 3pm on Friday the 13th of August in the 21st year after the resurrection of Christ. Her glorious Assumption occurred three days later on Sunday the 15th of August.

We find that AD 33 plus AD 21 yields AD 54 for the date of the Dormition and Assumption of Mary. However, when we confer with the Julian calendar calculator, we find that the Friday does not fall on the 13th of August in the year AD 54. There is, however, a problem with the math in the preceding paragraph. Christ did not live out a full 33 years (he died in the middle of his 33rd year) and Mary did not live out a full 21 years beyond the resurrection of Christ our Lord. So, we should not look for AD 54, but for AD 53. And in the Julian calendar AD 53, the 13th of August is a Friday and the 15th of August is Sunday. If we are to trust the vision of Maria Agreda, AD 53 in the Julian calendar fits rather perfectly.

According to the vision of Venerable Maria Agreda, three days after Her soul was taken to heaven, the Lord manifested His will, that Mary should return to the world, resuscitate Her sacred body and unite Herself with it, so that She might in body and soul be again raised to the right hand of Her divine Son without waiting for the general resurrection of the dead. When the time for this wonder had arrived, Christ Our Savior Himself descended from heaven bringing with Him at His right hand the soul of His Blessed Mother, accompanied by legion of angels, the patriarchs and

ancient prophets. They came to the sepulcher in the valley of Josaphat, and all being gathered in the sight of the virginal temple, the Lord spoke the following words to the saints: My mother was conceived without stain of sin, in order that from Her virginal substance I might stainlessly clothe myself in the humanity in which I came to the world and redeemed it from sin. My flesh is Her flesh; She cooperated with Me in the works of redemption; hence I must raise Her, just as I rose from the dead, and this shall be at the same time and hour; for I wish to make Her like Me in all things (pp.784-785). The purest soul of our Lady at the command of the Lord entered Her virginal body, reanimated it and raised it up. The Most Blessed Mary issued from the tomb in body and soul.... This happened in the hour after midnight, in which also the Lord had risen from the grave.
